Dear Shoshana friends.

This Christmas newsletter reaches you with great **joy and gratitude**. I am always overwhelmed that you support us so loyally, even though I rarely get in touch. We, Bindu, I and all our Shoshana members, appreciate it very much.

We have achieved a lot again this year and I would like to share it with you. It is a great success that Bindu has taken over the work completely and is responsibly managing our projects with new ideas. We currently **have 11 sewing projects, 17 medical centers and 1 computer center**. Bindu visited some women in the slum areas who successfully completed the sewing course last year and are now reporting how they are doing.

My name is **Rebeca Rani**. I was a student at Shoshana Sewing Centre Gannavaram. I come from a backward tribal community. I was one of the very first women to complete the tailoring course in 2023. I am **married** and **have two children**.

My husband is a **garbage collector** and **sewage cleaner**. Unfortunately, he is very irresponsible and does not take care of my family's needs. Most of the time he is drunk and unemployed. My health is also not good so I could not work as a daily wage laborer. I **could not feed my children or send them to school.**



Shoshana offered me to take a free sewing course. After completing the course, they provided me with a sewing machine and the necessary equipment to start my own business. With their encouragement, I started a tailoring shop in my village Indupalli. The government provided me with temporary accommodation to set up the shop. I have been working as a tailor for almost a year now. I am very happy to be financially independent and to be

able to support my family and give my children a better life.

I thank all Shoshana donors who help many women like me to have a better life.



My name is **Martha.** 28yrs old. I am a school dropout. I am married and I have two daughters. My husband was an auto driver. He was an alcoholic and was not taking care of the family responsibilities. I use to work as a domestic helper. My children are still small kids and I couldn't leave them alone and go to work.

Because of his bad habits, my husband got paralyzed and is bedridden. All the family burdens fell on me. Besides that, I had to take care of my husband's medical expenses which is extremely difficult for me. I was depressed and even thought of ending my life.

In this situation Ms. Hemima, instructor at Shoshana sewing center, **Giripuram**, **Vijayawada** heard my story and encouraged me to **join the sewing class**. With her support I was able to finish the class and Shoshana provided me with a sewing machine to **start working** immediately after finishing the tailoring course.





I opened my own shop at home and started working. Slowly my income started growing. I am able to earn 300 to 500 rupees per day depending on my orders. Since I am working at home it is convenient for me to take care of my kids as well as attend my husband.

My children started going to school and I am able to give them a decent life.

All thanks to my instructor Ms. Hemima and Martha Madam for providing me with an **opportunity to change my distressed life** into a more **self-reliant** and meaningful life.

Whole hearted thanks to all the donors for helping many needy women like me.



My name is **M.Kavitha**. I am 25 years old. I am married and have two daughters. My parents died when I was very young. I used to beg on the streets and my neighbors supported me to some extent. After my marriage, I lived with my husband in Gamela Bazar area of Vijayawada where some garbage collectors live. After a few years of my marriage, my husband also left me. I was left alone with my two children. I worked as a garbage collector and sometimes also begged for food to feed my family. Since we live in a terrible situation in slums, society mostly treats us as untouchables. No tailor likes to sew clothes for us.

When **Shoshana offered us a free sewing class**, I was very happy to take the opportunity. I was in the very first group. After completing the class, we were **given sewing machines**. So far, no strangers have come to our area to give us work, but at least we have been **able to sew clothes for ourselves and our children**. This way, we have been able to save some money on sewing expenses. I hope that we can make this our profession in the future.



Thank you to the donors who have come all the way to our area and helped us learn a skill that will enable us to earn a living.



These are three women among many others whose **lives** we have been able to **improve considerably** thanks to our joint venture.
